The points listed above are explained in detail below.

1. Rules of conduct on the event site

- ✓ A mouth and nose protection (FFP2/surgical face mask) must be brought along and worn indoors (for example at the boot Düsseldorf tent for Check in).
- ✓ A minimum distance of 1.5m to other people (except team partners) must be kept.
- ✓ Wash and disinfect hands regularly
- ✓ Sneeze and cough into the bend of your arm
- ✓ Group gatherings are prohibited
- ✓ Before and during the event NO training is allowed!

➔ **Failure to comply with the rules and instructions of the organization staff may result in exclusion from the event.**

2. Entry requirements for Schleswig-Holstein, Germany

3. Arrival, harbour map and parking

If you are either recovered, tested or fully vaccinated, you will receive an accreditation at check-in, which is valid for the duration of your competition days (only for active participants). This makes it easier for you to access the event area so that you don't have to show your ID to the security personnel every time.

There will be no trailer service. For the entrance to the harbour area the rules are the same as in the last years. A deposit of €50.00, which is recommended to be paid by card, will allow entry for 60 minutes. Vehicles and road trailers must be removed from the harbour within this time.

The Trailerwiese, the Salzwiesen, the Fördestraße and the Tempest parking lot are available for parking.

The harbour is divided into areas according to boat classes. Please refer to the harbour map to find your assigned places. These are obligatory and also uses the ramps there for slipping.

4. Check-in

Masks are compulsory indoors, i.e. also at check-in. To ensure a smooth and contactless process, it is essential that **every participant** brings along **proof of recovery/vaccination or a negative test**, the **disclaimer**, the **check-in report**, the **personal information form** and, if applicable, the **crew list** and **declaration of consent for minors**, completed and signed. All documents are available on M2S - either in the registration itself or under "Documents".

At the check-in, each boat (except coaches, J/24, J/70 and offshore classes) will receive an RFID wristband, which must be held daily before leaving and after returning to a terminal marked by large yellow flags (sign-out/sign-in).

Aal Regatta and Welcome Race:

Check-in for the Aalregatta and Welcome Race will take place on Friday, 03.09. from 15:00 - 21:00, and Saturday, 04.09. from 08:00 - 09:00 in Düsternbrook. Check-in in Kiel-Schilksee is NOT possible!

5. Sailing Instructions

6. Kiel-Week -App

Like last year, you can find all important dates and times at [KiWo.App](#). After entering the class and sail number, you will get access to race info, digital flagpole, protests, weather and results.

7. Digital flagpole

Like last year, there is the digital flagpole, which can also be accessed via the app. With the help of the digital solution, you don't have to wait in the harbour in case of a possible postponement of the start, but can follow the planning from your accommodation.

8. Skippers meeting via Go-To-Meeting

In order to avoid large gatherings, the meetings are held online. The links for each class can be found in the SI under point 6.

9. Corona security number

For worries, comments and questions during the event, the Corona security number is at your service. After a short announcement, you can address your concerns specifically. Please note this number: **+49 431/979980 20**.

After a first contact by phone, there is the possibility to meet an expert in person. One of the meeting points is a decentralized meeting location.

10. Test offer

Two test stations are available on the grounds. Here you can take a free quick test. To do this, you need to book an appointment and register at www.testen-sh.de/. The test result will then be sent to you by email. We recommend that you take advantage of this offer regularly.

11. Camping site

The access to the camping site is also regulated by a separate accreditation. All important information and rules of conduct are described in the hygiene concept.

Participants staying at the camping site are strongly encouraged to read them.

The camping site is also only accessible for sailors of the respective part. An earlier arrival is therefore not possible.

12. Helly Hansen printing service

As the official clothing partner of Kiel Week, Helly Hansen is once again offering a special service in its spacious store in the sponsors' mile: In addition to the current collection, all visitors can look forward to a new extensive Kiel Week collection! All styles and products can also be individually printed directly in the store.
